- Gather needed equipment:
 - Curved hemostat
 - o 11 blade scalpels for I&D
 - Tissue Forceps
 - Skin Simulation I&D Pad
- Practice Procedure
 - o Examine abscess identify pointing
 - Palpate fluctuant area
 - Incise at pointing (enter at 90 degree angle)
 - State next steps (culture, packing, prescribing antibiotic coverage MRSA/strep)
