

PhD & DNP w/ FNP Specialty Dual Degree Option (BSN Pathway)

2024-2025 Program of Study

The Program of Study is the required curriculum for the dual degree option. The curriculum is sequenced to support students' academic trajectory. The program of study lists courses required for every semester. DNP courses are only available once a year. Therefore, it is imperative to follow the Program of Study each semester when registering for classes. Students should meet with their faculty advisors minimally once a semester to review their program of study. The student's responsibility is to follow their Program of Study and notify their faculty advisors to request changes to their Program of Study. Changes to the Program of Study will impact the projected graduation date and require approval by the faculty advisors.
