## The ADHD and Learning/Career Assessment Project

The ABLE Clinic has the opportunity to provide University of Arizona students with assessment services related to ADHD and academic difficulties.

## What is the purpose of this project?

- To formally assess students who may have ADHD
- To formally assess academic-related difficulties; determine presence of a learning disorder
- Screen for any psychological distress
- Explore career/major interests for those who are undecided given their overall profile

## How will this help our students?

- To determine if they have ADHD or any other significant problems that are presenting as barriers to being successful at UArizona
- Provide objective data on students' cognitive and academic strengths and weaknesses
- Direct the student to the appropriate campus-based services
- Assist learning specialists and other campus-based providers with data-driven recommendations based upon a student's profile

The following is criteria for a student to be referred for an <b>ADHD evaluation</b> :	
☐ The student is actively enrolled in at UArizona	
☐ The student does not have health insurance or their insurance is not taken by Campus	
Health/CAPS	
and/or	
☐ The student has academic-related difficulties in addition to ADHD symptoms	

If a student meets either criteria above, please have them contact the ABLE Clinic at 520-626-2982 or <a href="mailto:able-clinic@arizona.edu">able-clinic@arizona.edu</a>. It is important to note that students will first be screened to determine the appropriateness of an ADHD evaluation; thus, a referral does not automatically mean they will be able to have a diagnostic evaluation.
