The Assessment of Behavior and Learning for Excellence (ABLE) Clinic services the University of Arizona and the state by providing individuals with comprehensive evaluations.

The ABLE Clinic offers the following types of evaluations for children ages 6+ and adults:

- **Psychological Evaluation:** To determine the presence of a psychological disorder that may be interfering with an individual's ability to function.
- Psychoeducational Evaluation: To determine the presence of an intellectual disability or a specific learning disorder.
- Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) Evaluation: To determine the presence of one of the three types of ADHD.
- Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) Evaluation: To determine the diagnosis of ASD and the specific accompanying impairments.
- Neuropsychological Evaluation:

Assesses a client's cognitive functioning, particularly if there is a known congenital disorder, history of epilepsy, traumatic brain injury, to rule out dementia, or any other medical ailments that can affect one's thinking and behavior.

• Vocational/Career Evaluation:

Assesses a client's cognitive, psychological, motor dexterity, and vocational interests to determine employability or post-secondary education and training.
