


## Viewing Threaded Discussions in Grid Form


1) Click the dropdown menu for the topic you wish to view and select “View Topic in Grid View”.

2) On the next page you will see the discussion posts listed in a grid view. Select the post you wish to read and it will appear below the page break line. To view another post, simply click a new post from above the page break line. Note that depending on how many posts you have or how long of a post you have you may need to move the page break line up or down. When you hover the mouse over the line an up/down arrow icon will appear to allow you to do this. (See below screenshot.)
