Great Apps for Reading, Writing, Dictating & Notetaking

All UA CON students have access to Read & Write, Microsoft OneNote and Office 365 Dictate apps. These are great tools to help with reading, organizing notes, recording lectures, dictating, and streamlining notetaking. And best of all, it is *free* to our students!

- Read & Write is text-to-speech software with tools to assist students with reading, writing, studying and research. This app can "read aloud" any *electronic* textbook, web page, WORD doc and pdf. The software's tools have the potential to increase student success and include:
 - o Text-to-speech listen to documents and web pages
 - Create an MP3 of documents to listen on the go
 - o Color Overlay apply a color filter to make reading easier
 - Highlighting tools highlight key points in the document
 - o Dictionary to look up terms

DRC highly recommends students download the Chrome Extension to read online exams or articles/websites. (Check with faculty and exam proctoring services before taking exams to make sure software is compliant with your test taking situation.)

- Microsoft OneNote: All UA students have access to Microsoft OneNote through their Office 365 package. The app allows users to audio record lectures with sound being linked to their notes. - **Office 365 Dictate** is voice recognition software available to all UA students as part of the Office 365 package. Dictation software lets you use speech-to-text to author content in Office with a microphone and reliable internet connection. It is a quick and easy way to get your thoughts out, create drafts or outlines, and capture notes. To activate Office 365 Dictate please go to Microsoft's support page to learn more.
