#### MEPN ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All requirements and deadlines are subject to change. See MS-MEPN website at https://www.nursing.arizona.edu/mepn-apply

- Bachelor's degree in any field
  - Applicants may have their degree in progress at the time of application but must provide proof of May graduation prior to the start date of MS-MEPN itself. Applicants who end up not graduating, or graduating after MS-MEPN has started, will have admission revoked.
- Prerequisite coursework completed with grades of C or higher. Additionally, grades must be posted by application deadline.
- Minimum last-60 grade point average of 3.0
- Minimum prerequisite grade point average of 3.0
- Minimum score of 75% on the HESI entrance exam (Math, Reading Comprehension, Vocabulary, and Biology)
- Admission to the University of Arizona graduate college as a degree-seeking student

### Application Deadlines for MS-MEPN

Students seeking admissions to the MS-MEPN program must apply through Nursing CAS and the UA Graduate College by the relevant deadlines listed on the MS-MEPN website at 11:59pm EST (see below).

If enrolled at the time of application and given admissions offer, applicants must maintain their 3.0 last-60 GPA and prerequisite GPA minimum after completion of any in-progress coursework.

Final official transcripts for in-progress courses must be submitted and verified by NursingCAS by January 11.

Applicants may have their degree in progress at the time of application but must provide proof of May graduation prior to the start date of MS-MEPN itself. Applicants who end up not graduating, or graduating after MS-MEPN has started, will have admission revoked.
