MEPN ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- · Bachelor's degree in any field
 - Applicants may have their degree in progress at the time of application but must provide proof of May graduation prior to the start date of MS-MEPN itself. Applicants who end up not graduating, or graduating after MS-MEPN has started, will have admission revoked.
- Prerequisite coursework completed with grades of C or higher. Additionally, grades must be posted by application deadline.
- Minimum last-60 grade point average of 3.0
- Minimum prerequisite grade point average of 3.0
- Minimum score of 75% on the HESI entrance exam (Math, Reading Comprehension, Vocabulary, and Biology)
- Admission to the University of Arizona graduate college as a degree-seeking student

Nursing College admission is based on a holistic review of criteria, including:

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Prerequisite GPA (Highest grade for each prerequisite course)	Prerequisite GPA of a minimum 3.0 GPA for all prerequisite courses, with a minimum grade of 'C' or better in each required course. If a prerequisite course is repeated, the highest grade earned will be utilized in the calculation.
Last-60 units GPA	The last-60 units is taken based on the grades earned in your most recent coursework taken at regionally accredited institutions. This includes both undergraduate and graduate level coursework, but does not include grades without weight (S,P,F, audits, etc.). The GPA is calculated on a semester-by-semester check until a minimum of 60 semester units have been totaled.
Optional Experience	Optional experiences that may be included to increase application strength include: healthcare experience, volunteerism, transferable non-healthcare experiences, and leadership experiences.
HESI Admissions Assessment	Students must take the HESI Admissions Assessment with a 75% minimum score based on a single attempt. Details on nursing website regarding score expirations and considerations: nursing.arizona.edu
Interview	A virtual interview is required portion of the admissions process. Interview is included in the application.

Application Deadlines for MS-MEPN

Students seeking admissions to the MS-MEPN program must apply through <u>Nursing CAS</u> and the <u>UA Graduate College</u> by the relevant deadlines listed on the <u>MS-MEPN website</u> at **11:59pm** <u>EST</u> (see below).

If enrolled at the time of application and given admissions offer, applicants must maintain their 3.0 last-60 GPA and prerequisite GPA minimum after completion of any in-progress coursework.

Courses must be complete and official transcripts must be available showing course completion by June 1 (for fall start), January 1 (for spring start), March 30 (for summer start) if offered admission. If you are repeating a course at the time of application, you cannot report it as in-progress; you must use the previously earned grade until a new grade is earned.

Applicants may have their degree in progress at the time of Fall start application but must provide proof of August graduation prior to the start date of MS-MEPN itself. Applicants may have their degree in progress at the time of Spring start application but must provide proof of December graduation prior to the start date of MS-MEPN itself. Applicants may have their degree in progress at the time of Summer start application but must provide proof of May graduation prior to the start date of MS-MEPN itself. Applicants who end up not graduating, or graduating after MS-MEPN has started, will have admissions rescinded.
